Our next big school event is the school musical 'Olivia' which takes place on April 3rd, 4th & 5th so make sure you get your ticket when they become available.

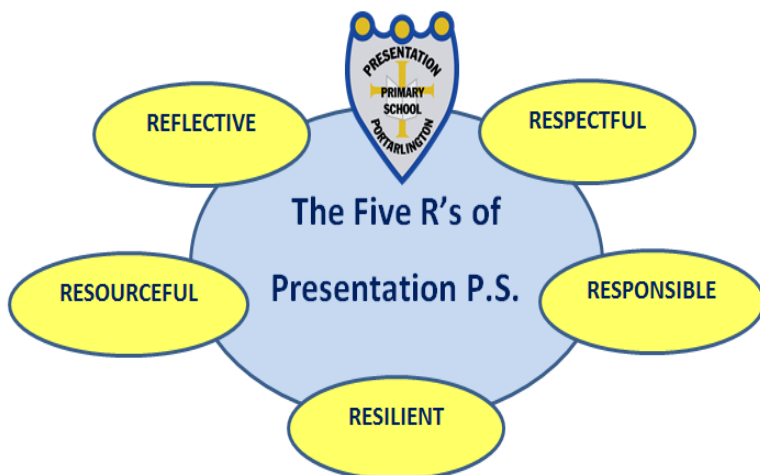
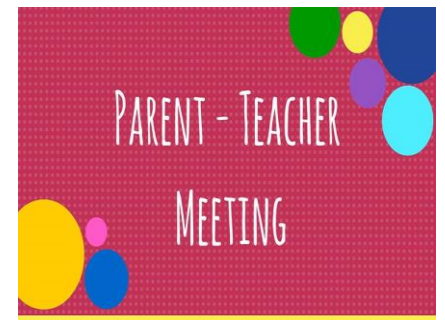
